interpreted that as being a concurring power.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Freedlander?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: In answer to Mr. Case, the answer is Yes, if we are planning on any kind of metro-

politan government or district, call it what you will, there is going to be some sharing of their taxation powers in order to perform a joint function. That is

the meaning of this as I understand it.

MR. CASE: I just asked.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think it is contemplated by the Committee from the discussions I have heard that what they are talking about is joint administration of functions and powers. If, for instance, under the public general law two Counties were authorized to impose an income tax, they could provide one method or means by which the tax would be administered jointly.

MR. CASE: Isn't it perfectly obvious that if, as the Commission indicates, and this is, and I think it is right, that the Counties are the creatures of the General Assembly that you don't need anything in the

Constitution to give the Legislature the power to permit
