

1 County. How is it going to upset the structure of that
2 County? But realistically, at the same time you are
3 going to have to consider the interest of that area
4 losing territory. We are all aware that changing of
5 boundaries is no longer that of moving undeveloped land.
6 It is a very realistic problem of the total financial
7 and fiscal resources of any area that is moving at that
8 time. This would indicate that the power really should
9 remain in the General Assembly, because otherwise you
10 are going to freeze your boundaries. You will say, If
11 we are going to referendum, we are going to freeze our
12 existing boundaries and leave them where they are and
13 accept entities of Counties as they are.

14 And if the General Assembly cannot, at that
15 point, effect any change necessary, this truly leads you
16 into the next stage of this thing, which is given that
17 set of circumstances, what tool can be given to the
18 Legislature to form those meaningful areas for government,
19 accepting the fact that at this moment boundary lines
20 are not meaningful in those rapidly developing areas
21 where development does not respect the boundary line.
