1 and that although storm drainage may go from one County 2 to another, that in fact, this is not a matter of State wide concern. It is a matter of local concern, but it 3 4 does affect more than one political subdivision.

> .This is the dilemma which we cite at the We are watching with a great deal of interest what does come out, that these matters really be a matter of concern to this particular Commission at this point. THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Kostritsky.

> > Mr. Brooks?

MR. BROOKS: Some of you may want to refer to the Staff memo included in your materials. This summer we had with us a graduate student from Johns Hopkins named John Elwood, who contributed to researching a number of the questions in the area of local government, Also very fortunately, we had for two weeks Walter Barnett that we borrowed from a law firm in the City that helped with the drafting of the draft you have dated the 14th. Also this particular draft shares some of my own views.

As the Committee's own discussions have progressed, some

of the discussions among the Staff and our studies have
