

1 that they then have the paramount power over all of  
2 the territory included within their boundaries, and this  
3 immediately raised problems as to what you do about the  
4 cities in that the cities either have to be separated  
5 from the Counties altogether or they must have some kind  
6 of concurrent powers over the areas in which they control  
7 within the County. This was resolved in favor of the  
8 County having the power to grant its own powers to  
9 municipalities, and any territory, and regulating the  
10 creation of these. There are two alternatives here.

11 I mentioned a moment ago alternative 2 which  
12 is what I conceived or understood to be the Committee's  
13 determination. Perhaps it is more elaborately worded  
14 than what they would want. Alternative 1 is another draft  
15 which says virtually the same thing, but is somewhat  
16 shorter, but it took liberties in redrafting the whole  
17 first provision the Committee submitted, and the last  
18 Section is, in fact, a similar section to the interstate  
19 agreement that appears in the Committee Report, except  
20 this entire document uses cities rather than municipal  
21 corporations in order to clearly define it without having
