mental mechanism for dealing with area-wide problems on a coordinated responsible base. Whenever the word, responsible, is used, this means somehow directly responsible to the people that they are acting for.

Number two, disparities between tax and service boundaries which means that the larger the number of independent governmental jurisdictions within a metropolitan area, the more inequitable and difficult becomes the process of financing those governmental services which by their nature, are area-wide in character.

Three, State constitutional and statutory restrictions, namely, barriers to modernizing the structure and functions of local governments in metropolitan areas especially with regard to the organization and functions of County government, including the role to tax and borrow money.

Lastly, number four, metropolitan area problems very often cross State lines. One-fifth of our nation's people are contained in 26 metropolitan areas that include territory in two or more States. Nowhere has there been an adequate solution to coordinating and
