Of course, that does not exclude and I want
it clearly kept in mind, that does not exclude the
permissive referendum which would be provided for in
the Constitution with respect to any bill.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes.

MR. SYKES: Mr. Chairman, I have a question first. I understood the Chair to say that all the people who had been working on this were in agreement that if there was to be any kind of governmental authority transcending county lines, it should be the same authority for all functions that transcended county lines that might be granted to such a form of government.

It would seem to me that if that is true, it is inconsistent to provide for any form of super county government except the regional government and that if you provide for intergovernmental authorities in addition to regional governments, you are doing what the Chair says nobody wants to do.

Now is this language of the Committee a considered approach and was the Chair in error in its statement about the agreement on regional government?
