because the problem may be one that one would be
 applicable and most applicable to rather than the other.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Freedlander,

MRS. FREEDLANDER: I don't want to disagree with my Chairman but I think there was a difference in opinion in regard to proliferation of districts. There were some of us who felt we did not want to have more districts than we have now, that we either wanted a dormant organization that could be used or one that could be created but under no circumstances did we want a proliferation of authorities and districts.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Burdette.

DR. BURDETTE: Mr. Chairman, I agree with
Mrs. Freedlander's point but I would like to emphasize,
if I may. We have a difference in the Committee. I
think the Chairman of the Committee reports precisely
the way the Committee vote came out for flexibility.
Now I am hesitant but I think I ought to say that overnight I am coming around somewhat to changing my position
on this matter and I should like to say to the Commission
that I have done so because I have been doing some
