I should support the view of an extraordinary majority. I, therefore, support this system of extraordinary majorities for a state where there is great diversity coupled with some underpopulation in some of the key areas of that diversity. I do that because I think that if we should get the state into an area of bitterness, not so easily acquired in states in the West, for example, where the basic economy is often quite similar, I think we have made a great mistake. We have this problem in Montana where there is bitterness between the western mining and eastern grazing. I don't think we ought to get a type of bitterness that runs so deep within the roots that might happen without an 14 extraordinary majority.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett.

MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, I am going to vote in opposition to the provision for extraordinary majority and would like to explain why. In the compromise which has just been voted down thirteen to five providing for a referendum, there was protection to the area directly affected and that was what I was auxious to see
