would agree wholeheartedly with the remarks made by
Mr. Brooks. I think in theory he is absolutely right,
and I think that in most instances in practice that is
the principle that should be followed. I would
not follow with him in this case, however, because it
seems to me that the state is just emerging from a
situation where to use the hacknied phrase, the Legislature
has been subject to rural domination and it is now
entering a phase where I think it can and will be said
that the Legislature is subject to urban domination.

First off, I would say that normally I

I don't know that I would say I am afraid of the tyranny of the majority because I am not. What I do fear is that there could be in such a Legislature a brushing aside of purely local interests that meant a great deal and were vital to the people affected and yet were not really of enormous importance to the state as a whole.

I can see that in the area where Legislature may be considering abolishing or changing the boundaries of counties on the Eastern Shore or in Southern Maryland
