assigned to it which is the reason for proposal that is in the staff memo that there be rather than an authority, some kind of provision for the creation of some kind of governmental structure that would be representative in character and that could create and set up a smaller government with as few personnel or as many required to deal with the various tasks which should be dealt with on an intergovernmental basis.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller.

MR. MILLER: There might be some way of side-stepping this by the Legislature providing for the creation of commissions independent of regional authority. For instance, we have a State Roads Commission that is statewide and tends to all the roads. I, for many years, advocated a State Water Commission on the same basis of obtaining the water of the Chesapeake Bay without having to fall back on the government.

Could we have this limitation on regional governments and at the moment leave the door open so that the Legislature could appoint a Water Pollution Commission that would be similar to the State Roads
