Commission and administer that particular problem.

MR. CLAGETT: I think that is exactly what is meant by the phrase civil division. It does emit that possibility. In other words, it emits of that possibility along with any others that may even be better as time and circumstance may require in the future.

MR. HARGROVE: I think what we are really doing, we are delving into the unknown again. I think we have not dealt with regional governments in the past but yet we are attempting to anticipate what the problems will be because we operate under a system today of a lot of proliferation of agencies within both the local and state government.

I think here is a chance really to let the Legislature operate. I agree with Mr. Scanlan 100 per cent. I think that is their responsibility to determine in the future just what intergovernment authorities are needed. We don't know what will happen 15, 20, or 30 years from now but if we should say only have one such authority, then what Mr. Brooks has said comes into play
