that your discussion is an assumption which is not an entirely valid one and that is that a regional government is a complete government. We are talking, the general debate has indicated that you may be thinking of regional government that is perhaps more accurately called an authority because it only exercises one or two functions.

I thought the debate on the previous question indicated pretty clearly that the Commission felt that this was the area where you simply couldn't define. I think in substance your notion is the same unless you are going to limit to a case where there was a complete regional government in one area and I suggest to you that might be awfully difficult.

MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, may I add to what you have said there that what you are also doing, I am afraid, is imposing a degree of restriction upon action by the General Assembly and may be defining guide lines which should not be defined at this stage and should not be imposed upon the General Assembly when it does meet and deal with this question. I feel we are
