being the problem after the creation of the region.

MR. SYKES: That is right, and I thought when the Chair stated what the general areas of agreement where with everybody working on the problem, among everybody working on the problem, that it was agreed that the whole point of creating a regional government, going that far was that all problems within the region that would be delegated to an agency beyond the county would be delegated to that regional government.

THE CHAIRMAN: I did, indeed.

MR. SYKES: And, of course, Mr. Martineau pointed out that you might have problems transcending regions and you want to leave the leeway there. But if that is agreed to, then it seems to me that the new suggestion that I made would be carry out the agreement and without that suggestion being acted on by the Commission, the result would be the exact opposite of what the Chair said all the scholars had agreed upon.

THE CHAIRMAN: I dich't mean that all the scholars had agreed upon but I am merely talking about the people working here. I think the difference is this,
