you. Does anyone wish to move any alternate?

MR. SYKES: I would like some information from Mr. Brooks or from the Chairman as to the theory of the difference. So far we have been unanimous along the line in cutting out restrictions on the legislative power.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me answer you by saying that we will give you both because our views are not exactly the same. I can state my views on this particular part of the problem very, very briefly. The difference here is whether you are going to say to the Legislature you have the authority to create a regional government.

Do so wherever it is necessary and saying that the Legislature has the authority to create a regional government where necessary, the counties have the regional government where necessary and if neither of them act, the people in that area can activate the regional government. My own feeling is that the problem is one that is going to require some push on the Legislature to get it operating in certain areas. I think the discussion here has indicated that the problem
