DR. BURDETTE: It is 115.

MR. BROOKS: We know of some 53 from my own survey that existed in this area already. Now these groups are special interest groups in that they are set up to resist anything that would destroy their own authority. This works against the creation of any kind of regional government. So if regional government is a solution for the multiplicity of these authorities, it requires additional push as the Chairman said. It requires really some structure to promote it. So the idea of the staff memo was to give an outline that would challenge the efforts, that would channel, excuse me, the efforts that are now being directed through authorities in a unified coordinated fashion under a single authority that would be representative in nature.
