the Constitution shall be limited merely to an authorization to the Legislature to create regional governments. Secondly, whether instead of that the Constitution should provide a skeleton for a regional government to be called into existence.

The second question -- when needed -- the second question, it seems to me, is whether the Legislature may call into existence a regional government or whether it may be called into existence by the governments of the parties participating units or popular election or the Legislature or any one of the three.

The third issue and a very important one is whether or not regional governments shall be required by the Constitution to be representative government.

By that I mean governments in which the legislative powers are exercised by representatives directly elected by the people. I think these are the three principal policy questions that are inherent in this section.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Isn't there another one,
Mr.Ency, about whether or not any other authority?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, whether any other
