before you debate that you've got to keep in mind in consideration of this provision the provision that has no article in the section yet, the first section recommended by the Committee on Taxation yesterday which says that no tax shall be imposed by any unit of government, state or local, except by elected representatives of the people so that if you did not provide that the regional government had to be represented and the legislature created one which was not representative, then under the other provision, it could not exercise the taxing power.

JUDGE ADKINS: The proposition is self-evident and doesn't require much debate.

MR. MARTINEAU: I can't say that I agree with that. It all depends on how you view this regional government. If a regional government is a complete government, I can see the point. If the regional government is a great deal less than a complete one, that is one exercising only one or two powers similar to that exercised by authority such as sewage and transportation, I see no reason for it to be an elected representative
