DR. TEMPLETON: Mr. Chairman, frequent reference was made during the past discussion to the current Commission. Will there be any light given us during this day and a half as to how we tie into them, how we tie in with them or they with us?

THE CHAIRMAN: I don't know a great deal would be said about it. The Curlette Commission has not published any reports. As a matter of fact, it is just getting under way its study of the departments. It has not yet undertaken the really comprehensive study. We have been giving some thought to trying to work out with them an arrangement to make the research that Judge Adkins referred to as sort of perhaps a cooperative project, because it is the sort of thing they will need as well as us.

I would anticipate that the Curlette Commission would be far behind us in our recommendations. They will be very detailed recommendations, whereas we are dealing only with the general structure. I think Judge Adkins' point was merely to have this Commission aware of the broad scope of activities of the Curlette Commission
