If we have regional governments with appointees who have equal weight from small units against large units, both in population and in financial strength, the real fact is that the regional government will not function.

MR. CLAGETT: I think it is important to appreciate that what we are really voting on here is whether or not the Constitution shall mandate representative regional government. I do point out that in the Committee's draft, when you get to that issue and determine it, the representative principle is not excluded.
