the county, as Hal put it, die on the vine and the 1 authority such as we have today. Because the difficulty 2 is that the authority doesn't have the power to act. 3 It is an advisory thing. And maybe the authority could be given enough teeth by the Legislature to be really a, 5 have enough power and if so, then it goes over the shadows into this area of the government. It is not 7 in my mind a clear-cut distinction. 8 JUDGE ADKINS: You don't draw any distinction 9 between the power to tax and the power to implement 10 decision? 11 THE CHAIRMAN: Oh, I do draw a distinction. 12 Put the word effective in quotes. You could not certainly 13 have a fully effective regional government without the 14 power to tax. 15 JUDGE ADKINS: Do we want a fully effective 16 one? 17 THE CHAIRMAN: I personally do. 18 JUDGE ADKINS: Then you have to have elected 19 representatives, don't you? 20 THE CHAIRMAN: I think that is true. 21
