and each of the proponents of that idea have said you will draw from the counties and you will draw from the General Assembly, so you are going to be drawing away powers that you are giving to the local subdivisions and giving to the General Assembly. You are creating a separate intermediate form of government.

Now notwithstanding the fact that there is a pocket where some such solution might be advisable or might be a good one, nevertheless insofar as the state as a whole is concerned, that is not true. You don't have the necessity for an intermediate form of government with all the ramifications that go with it. I don't mean to do other than to point out certain problems.

We have just gone through a primary election where the voting machine wasn't capable of carrying all the names that you go in and vote for. If you create an intermediate government, you are introducing into the picture a greater degree of confusion.
