making the choice of representatives to make up that intermediate government. You are creating the very problem we have attempted to eliminate insofar as the counties and cities are concerned.

Now if we carry this thing to its logical extent, we are also saying that there will be no intergovernmental authorities. We have provided in the recommendation for regional governments if regional governments should be determined to be in the future the appropriate form of government but at the moment we have provided for intergovernmental authority.

The intergovernmental authority devices is one which could logically grow in the direction of a regional if and when the ultimate extension became the appropriate one. But in the meantime, as we deal with the immediate problems, the intermediate government authority method either are created by the General Assembly or agreement or compact entered into between the counties or the civil divisions as we define them can adequately deal with the problems. It has been said that if we don't give the guide lines, we don't give
