Commission.

JUDGE ADKINS: No. We have no intention of doing that. I think they will be six months behind us, as the Chairman suggests.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment on this specific question? Governor Lane?

GOVERNOR LANE: I don't know whether this would be helpful from personal experience, but it was my good fortune 35 years ago to be elected to the office of Attorney General, subsequently to the office of Governor and I found that the Constitution provided that if I didn't do what the Governor directed me to do, he could institute on proceedings to throw me out of office.

The second was with reference to the ability of the Governor. In very few instances I found objectionable appointees but there was no way in which, adequate way in which you could get rid of them. I think that is a limitation that should be cared for on each end.
