the provision to be included in the Constitution shall be permissive merely, that is authorizing the Legislature to create but nothing more or whether it should in addition provide skeleton for such regions as the skeleton term has been defined.

JUDGE ADKINS: Is there a motion on that?

THE CHAIRMAN: Simply in accord with your suggestion. Mr. Martineau.

MR. MARTINEAU: Doesn't this motion also go to the manner in which these regional governments are formed?

THE CHAIRMAN: No, that is a separate question to come up separately.

MR. MARTINEAU: I would like to speak
in favor of the Committee's viewpoint and going along
what

regions there are, how they are to be created or anything
