and Mr. Martineau when they say that however urgent this problem may be a constitutional mandate is not the way to solve it. It should be solved with the legislative mandate operating within permissive constitution limitations.

I support the Committee's view.

DR. JENKINS: The difficulty I find with the so-called skeleton arrangement is that the whole thing is so indefinite that we seem to say that we will set up five or less or fewer definite regions or departments but no two people on this Commission would agree on exactly what these regions are to do or these regional organizations or their form of government.

We leave that to the General Assembly. It seems to me that we should authorize this by the General Assembly and let the General Assembly set up their whole procedure.
