and because of the inconsistencies of their performance gave rise to the Greater London Metropolitan Government which is now one year old.

So the problem is with us now and it is
28 times magnified, the problem that should occur and
should be under consideration and it is a tremendous
problem. Someone asked whether or not the classification
of counties is in any way a limitation of the regions.

Of course, regional governments can be set up and be given grant of powers by the Ceneral Assembly from the state's powers and therefore does not require any kind of withdrawal necessarily, the powers of local government. It was being suggested in the staff memo that local governments should be able to create such governments and should be able to grant some of the powers that have been granted to them by the General Assembly to such an established regional government.

But there is no inherent limitation on the number of these regional governments through the classification of counties provision in that you do not
