THE CHAIRMAN: All right, I am afraid I have confused it. I did not mean to suggest that the vote now is going to be a vote necessarily on whether the local government or the people or a combination of the two is voting. That we can put up as a separate question. The question here involved is whether the regional government can be called into being only when and as the Legislature determines by the Legislature or whether it can be called into being by some other group.

MR. MARTINEAU: Mr. Chairman, I thought the question was whether the Constitution was to direct the Legislature to create the regions and then all other questions were being left to the future, or whether the Constitution merely said that the Legislature could create regional governments. I thought that was the issue.

THE CHAIRMAN: If you want to put it that way, we can. I think one involves the other. Mr. Miller.

MR, MILLER: I want to know whether what we are voting on would deprive the Legislature of the
