In other words, I personally wouldn't want to vote another restriction on our Legislature that represents the whole state and I don't approve of setting up a bit of machinery that would allow local units to do something without the permission of the Legislature or at least if the Legislature didn't want

THE CHAIRMAN: I would have to say, Mr.
Miller, in the light of the last comment that that
probably is the next question and not the question
presently presented. I suppose what you want as the
question presently presented is the way Mr. Martineau
last phrased it, namely, whether the Constitution shall
merely authorize the Legislature to create regional
governments or whether the Constitution shall say that
the Legislature shall create regional governments.

Now this doesn't resolve very much in my mind but maybe this is the way you prefer it.

DR. BURDETTE: Not create regional governments, but create regions. Isn't that the distinction you make?
