acts in forming regions, then the next question is or the next questions are how many regions will there be, will there be any restriction on the Legislature in creating regions and secondly whether the Legislature, only the Legislature can activate the regional government or can some other body do it.

THE CHAIRMAN: All right, let's take up next the question of whether the Constitution should have any limitation on the number of regions to be created by the Legislature, if it creates any and if so, what the number would be.

MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, I don't want to make it any more confusing, but I still don't think we have determined the question of whether or not, although, I think it is implicit and maybe this is really for clarification, the staff report and your report include a skeleton for regional government and provide for a method of a charter being drawn either by the local units themselves or by the General Assembly and either giving to that newly created unit certain powers.

That is what I thought we were speaking about when we
