long, which is no more similar, no more similarity between the problems of Cecil County in which we are now and the problems of Somerset County than there are between day and night and a governmental area comprising that area should it ever need a reasonable government would simply be impossible.

I point that out simply to say that again it seems to me impossible at this stage in history to regionalize the state in an effective way in the Constitution. Had this problem arisen twenty years ago, I suspect that the proposals made here would have been completely different. I don't know what they have been.

MR. MILIER: If I can interrupt, it would make an oyster stew.

JUDGE ADKINS: I would urge that first that there be no limitation. If that fails, I will urge that there be at least five if the five are going to be the ones you propose.
