then we will take another vote on how many. A vote no will be a vote against any constitutional limitation on the number of regions. Mr. Miller.

MR. MILLER: Would this define a minority or a limit on the number of counties that would be involved in a region?

THE CHAIRMAN: No, it would not.

MR. MILLER: It would just occur to me that the approach should be that it would, to have a region you ought to have X number of counties rather than if you limit the number of regions.

THE CHAIRMAN: This would not. I might say to you, Mr. Miller, that that phase of the matter has been discussed in Committee and by others and it runs into great problems. I think you can consider the possibility that in the future you may have a situation where you are dealing not with counties as you know them today or as their boundaries are today. I think you get into confusion worse than boundaries really.

MR. MILLER: I think so too but my thought is if you put an arbitrary limit as to the number of
