It would probably be helpful also to touch base with the Committee on the Judiciary Department.

MR. MILLER: Just on that point, Mr. Chairman, couldn't the Legislature at any time it wanted to employ any sort of legal advice and would it be necessary to put it in the Constitution? It seems to me rather an unusual provision to have an official attorney for a Legislature.
