correctly, first of all, as we have it, the Legislature 1 would have to set up some kind of general framework 2 for regional government. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: No. I would not say that. The vote that was taken was that the Legislature would 5 first have to create a region. DR. BURDETTE: Exactly. 7 THE CHAIRMAN: And the question now is 8 whether the Legislature shall set up the framework of 9 government or called into being by some other way. 10 DR. BURDETTE: Your wording is much better 11 than what I tried to word. I am impressed by the 12 point Mr. Martineau made has been taken care of under 13 the presumption we are operating under. The Legislature 14 has already said that there may be regions. 15 MRS. FREEDLANDER: The Constitution is saying 16 17 it.
