time when we don't have the necessary information and materials to work with.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry.

MR. GENTRY: Throughout the Committee's report, Mr. Clagett has referred to the aim of remaining flexible. Now here is a proposition suggested by the staff that would allow flexibility. It would allow this activation of the regional governments in any of these three ways. Now in reply to Mr. Martineau's suggestion that this is a matter of state importance and should be treated by the General Assembly, as I lead the staff's draft, any power, once vested, can be withdrawn by law would allow the check and the necessary check to the General Assembly to take such action as may be necessary if there has been an invisible activation through the operation of the board, legislative body within the region or the people within the region.

I would certainly favor any of the three methods.
