really, we are getting back into the very area where we have already made a determination and we are getting, the Commission is getting itself back into an area very similar to the problem that the Committee had to deal with.

We voted, as I understood it, a little while ago, that the responsibility for determining whether or not a regional government should be created rested squarcly with the General Assembly. Now we are moving away from that determination, namely that it is permissive with the General Assembly and we are creating other means by which it can be accomplished, namely by the people on the petition or by the action of the governing bodies of one or more counties.

It seems to me that what we are really doing is repeating ourselves rather than clarifying the situation.

THE CHAIRMAN: "Mr. Clagett, that is saying exactly what I said earlier. I thought the two questions were one but the Commission decided otherwise and I think we will make better time now if we try to resolve
