that the General Assembly and counties have been dealing with and now you are getting into the question of whether regional governments should have home rule.

THE CHAIRMAN: That is precisely the point and we might as well vote and then go to lunch.

It seems to me that you have put your finger on exactly what it is and that is the question of whether regional governments shall have home rule. We give the counties home rule. The only difference it seems to me between the counties and the region is that with respect to the county we are saying that it has all the powers of local government except what is withdrawn by general acc of the Legislature.

You can't do that with regions because it would be inconsistent with the action as to counties. Therefore, you have got to have machinery to do the reverse for regions. You have got to give them an expressed grant of power. It seems to me, however, that subject to that one limitation the procedure ought to be the same, namely that the General Assembly's power to grant or withdraw powers from a region should be only
