distinction was between the region and the regional government and the vote was based upon the assumption that the Legislature might act to create regions without creating a regional government which was the very assumption that the Chair found it almost impossible to make.

THE CHAIRMAN: Exactly, and I still do. Mr. Martineau.

MR. MARTINEAU: I think we all agreed with you up until the last point although I agree with you on the last point, I don't think we voted on it, that is the amendment of the form of government of the region which is that it can be changed, I think, we should permit it to be changed either by the Legislature or by the governments involved or the people involved, probably making everything subject to a referendum vote. But I don't think we discussed that or got into it at all.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry.

MR. GENTRY: That point is in the draft.
MR. BROOKS: Wait, wait, what point is that
