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20 21 such provision, what effect, if any, would it have on the office of Secretary of State and have you given any consideration to perhaps transferring some of the more formal duties of the Secretary of State to this particular office?

JUDGE ADKINS: We have not.

MR. POWER: The Constitution of Alaska creates the office of Secretary of State and the Secretary of State is almost identical to our Lieutenant Governor. It is just a question of label. In our third recommendation I think we suggest that the office of Secretary of State ought to be constitutionally abolished. I don't think we are really too concerned about the label for this office but we thought Lieutenant Governor was more expressive than Secretary of State.

MR. CASE: So that I am correct in thinking that the new Lieutenant Governor would in fact pick up a great many of the duties of the Secretary of State?

MR. POWER: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Winslow?
