five, six, eight, but create a government only for the one which seemed to be immediately necessary leaving it to future action by the General Assembly or by action of the local authorities to create government in other areas, just the same as it can do with counties.

THE CHAIRMAN: That would be possible.

Mr. Gentry.

MR. GENTRY: While you say it is inconceivable that is exactly what your draft is. Your draft, in 11.02 a step up 1970, these five departments.

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, I understand that but then I provided as an integral part of that that the government of that region would be called into existence by either the Legislature or the people. I do not think except in the kind of situation suggested by Dr. Winslow that the Legislature is going to do just that and stop. I think it is going to go ahead and provide regional government.

MR. GENTRY: It may.

MRS. BOTHE: Wouldn't it be some analogy as to what the Legislature might do in creating regions
