be defined by a classification?

MR. BROOKS: I do not think so.

MR. CLAGETT: I wouldn't think so either.

Then it would run afoul upon the restriction of the

General Assembly to pass local legislation.

MR. BROOKS: I wouldn't think so.

MR. SYKES: Can I address myself to that?
THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

MR. SYKES: This was a question I was going to raise. The power of classification in the draft, this raises another question, power classification in the draft is limited to counties. There is no limitation on the power of the General Assembly to legislate with respect to intergovernmental authorities or regions but the Legislature could take a section of Montgomery County and out of Montgomery County and add it to Howard County without changing the boundary of either county. What it would do would be to create a region consisting of one county and part of the other. It would give that region plenary governmental power, do nothing about the territories of the counties as such.
