of Secretary of State and Lieutenant Governor have taken into consideration what is becoming a trend in certain areas of creating an administrative management office, nonpolitical such as is true in Philadelphia and New York, an official who would take over, I should think, not only the duties which we are thinking of as those of Lieutenant Governor, but duties which would go much farther in the field of management.

JUDGE ADKINS: Doctor, I think it is fair to say we have not considered that as a constitutional matter. We have discussed the problem very generally but here again we have felt that that was a matter better left to those persons working in the field of reorganization of existing functions of the State rather than the constitutional level, because what might work today might not necessarily work in ten years.

DR. WINSLOW: What I was thinking was what you are referring to in terms of Lieutenant Governor does relate to the same field of area of activity except for succession.
