action of the Committee was as a result of a very strong recommendation being given by Dean Fordham that when you attempt to define general law, the proper definition should be as used here, one which in terms and effect apply to all countles rather than to the contrary, anything to the contrary.

MR. SYKES: It may not have effect in all.

It seems to me you are limiting the concept of the general law. I think we might as well vote on it.

MR. CLAGETT: Mrs. Kostritsky might ask you to make the comment there.

MRS. KOSTRITSKY: This is perhaps a bit different whereby if the law had been held to be a general law which provides a different method for docketing cases in county A from that in county B or a general law which sets the salaries of sheriffs and sets it in a different way are different laws, so long as it legislates in the field, legislates from county to county.

It has been determined to be a general law so long as it deals with the same subject.
