it is fair to say that our Commission has felt that aside from more or less formalistic duties, the Lieutenant Governor should not be in position to be a policy official except within the areas the Governor describes, because immediately you do that it seems to us that you then get a hybrid or hydra-headed situation, where policy can fall between two officials.

We haven't wanted to assign by the Constitution policy jobs to a Lieutenant Governor, for the simple reason that we didn't want that conflict of authority.

I don't know whether that is pertinent to your inquiry or not.

DR. WINSLOW: The office that I am talking about would normally be under the direction of the Governor. It would not be a separate policy making agent, except as the Governor would allow him to become. I was only thinking in terms of the duties of such an administrator in terms of what you are thinking, that

JUDGE ADKINS: I think that is a matter that we can very properly put on our agenda for further

the Lieutenant Governor would do.
