THE CHAIRMAN: What you are suggesting is that the Legislature with its power could create a region and thereby get power to pass local legislation and defeat our general prohibition?

MR. SYKES: That's right.

THE CHAIRMAN: And I say to you conceivably this could happen but I think the probability is very remote and it is a risk we will have to live with. I think the alternative is to tie us into knots. Any further discussion of this section? I think we've got to suspend consideration of this.

MR. CLACETT: Mr. Chairman, may I ask that we have five more minutes and in that five minutes I will confine myself to the time extention. May I have that five minutes?

THE CHAIRMAN: Go ahead.

MR. CLAGETT: Section 11.03 deals with the structure of county governments and consists of pages 19, 20, and 21. I would ask that that entire material be disregarded and in place of it this be substituted.
