and is not going to review the 16 proposed amendments
and, therefore, should not express any opinion.

Actually neither of those situations quite

answers the question. It seems to me that the problem is this.

Almost all and I think perhaps all of the

Almost all and I think perhaps all of the 16 amendments deal with matters that are touched upon in one way or the other by actions which this Commission has already taken. The 16 amendments will be acted upon at the next month's election and, of course, will be acted upon before the constitutional convention meets.

If an amendment is defeated and that amendment embodies not necessarily the same detail but the same principle as maybe recommended in the draft of the Constitution, we submit the argument could very well be made and I have no doubt it would be made in the convention that the convention should not adopt this principle because it has so recently been rejected by
