hunting for trouble? Aren't we in a position to say that regardless of what the people of Maryland decided with respect to amendments to the present Constitution that we are offering a new start and we are making it as interlocking and compact and so forth as we can and we are regardless of what they do in amending an ancient document, it seems to me we don't have to say what they did to that document, because all of the various provisions in our proposed Constitution will be interlocking and a principle might be there for the present Constitution that wouldn't apply to our new draft and I don't think we have to get into that.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes.

MR. SYKES: I would suggest that the statement that ought to be made by the Commission and the statement ought to be made is a statement that we take no position with respect to the individual constitutional amendments for the reasons suggested by Congressman Miller, that if these pass, they will pass in a different form of detail in any case and unless we say right now that we regard these amendments as additions to an old
