Constitution and as standing on the basis that the old 1 Constitution is still the instrument of government and 2 that it is an entirely different document and different 3 theory and different job from the one we have got, we are going to get hung up in the convention, one way or 5 the other. It will be very hard to endorse a provision 7 in substance but not in form and say we reserve the 8 right to change it because once the Legislature, the public has spoken and we have indicated that we set some 9 store by what they say insofar as our job is concerned, 10 11 we are in trouble. 12 MRS BOTHE: We have two different problems

MRS. BOTHE: We have two different problems here. Some of these amendments, most of them involve the mess the old Constitution is in and we are advertising for a new Constitution. Things like abolishing the Commissioner of the Land Office, which the Committee on Miscellaneous Provisions mentions in its report. On the other hand, the intermediate court of appeals itself is built into our proposal which the Committee seeks to abolish, not in the form it will appear on the amendment, but the principle involved is an integral part
