of our judiciary article and one if defeated at the 1 pools would have some devastating effect on the recommen-2 dations the Commission has already passed on. I don't know that it is wise. I don't think the proposal is 4 in any danger but I don't know it is wise for us to ignore 5 propositions of this kind which we do intend to perpetuate 6 in the new Constitution. I think it will be distinguished 7 from the housekeeping ones that are necessitated by 8 9 the condition of the old Constitution. 10 DR. BARD: I think we should make it

clear, Mr. Chairman, that these items that are being dealt with are those that have been given consideration by this body but that ours is a unitary approach and not a segmented one and that within this unitary approach we have dealt with these problems. It would occur to me that this is the way we should make known our position. I think too, however, that as individuals, not as members of this Commission, we might feel free to hold a position in regard to one or more of the items but I do think it would be wrong if we came out, let us say, with a listing of where we stand or a
