group speak in effect for us, I think we should remain quiet. I am afraid that rightly or wrongly some will think we are exceeding our authority and presenting ourselves as Constitutional seers and it could only lead to resentment and I don't think the political impact of this group is very significant on these issues anyway.

MR. MARTINEAU: Mr. Chairman, I think we ought to make a statement that only one designed to protect our proposals from any action taken by the electorate which would be that we would merely explain some of the amendments are consistent with our proposals, so we are inconsistent but that really in the longrun none of them should have any bearing on the convention because everything will be considered in a completely different frame of reference.

DR. BURDETTE: I prefer to remain silent, under the general principle that I prefer to reply even after we finish our work. I don't want to associate myself with any type of nonpartisan political organization by public appointment. I am putting it another way, that as a citizen I might campaign for a
