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announce any further meetings or any further business?

THE CHAIRMAN: No, I think we will have to do as I indicated at the beginning, ask you to keep the date of November 21, ask you not to swear at me when you get a call.

Now each of you, I think, has a copy of a memo from Mrs. Wiegand to me, dated October 19. And on the upper right corner it says extraordinary vote of the Legislature provisions in proposed articles of new Constitution. Now these, I think, represent the complete list. Section 8, the extraordinary vote for what was formerly called the emergency law, that is a law that is subjected to a referendum would take effect notwithstanding was three-fifths. It is not noted on the memo. Three-fifths was the vote required.

DR. WINSLOW: Does this then provide that under the present agreement there is no such thing as a suspension of a law on the basis of a petition. Is that what the decision was?

THE CHAIRMAN: No, the decision was that the law will not be suspended in the event of a referendum
